

"Do What It Says"

James take a very simple approach to Scripture. "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." (James 1:22)

The Bible was not intended to just be read. It was intended to be accepted, to be followed, to be put into practice. It was intended to make a difference in the way we live...in the way we think, the way we feel, the way we speak, and the way we behave.

The power of the word isn't found in exact pronunciation of words, nor careful inflection of voice when reading aloud. Its value isn't in its geography, its history, nor even its scientific accuracy. No, its value and its power are in its application...putting it into practice in life; doing what it says.

Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says. Anyone who listens to the word but does not do what it says is like a man who looks at his face in a mirror and, after looking at himself, goes away and immediately forgets what he looks like. But the man who look intently into the perfect law that gives free-

dom, and continues to do this, not forgetting what he has heard, but doing it—he will be blessed in what he does."

(James 1:22-25)

This "looking intently into the perfect law" does not suggest quantity of reading, reading just to be reading, nor reading to stay on a predetermined schedule. It isn't surface reading that is being discussed here. Of course, each of these types of reading may be necessary at times. But, buy the word "intently" James is suggesting deeper reading, studying, searching for meaning and understanding.

"And continues to do this" indicates that Bible study is becoming a habit, a way of life, a regular exercise. And he doesn't stop at study. He does two additional things. He holds on to what he is learning. He keeps it in him, "not forgetting what he has heard." Plus, he does it! He puts it into practice in his life. He lives it.

In Honor of Vernon K Fletcher

Our sister Dorothy Fletcher and her family received a blessing this week in regards to the service of their husband, father, brother, and grandfather, Vernon K. Fletcher, who died in the line-of-duty defending Port of Bremerton property at Bremerton National Airport. Please observe the following excerpts from the notice received by the family:

"In our communication with the fire departments, it was discovered your father's name was not listed on the federal memorial for DoD firefighters. With that discovery, NRNW Fire Chief Frank Montone arranged to have your father's name added to the Fallen Firefighter Memorial at Goodfellow Air Force Base in San Angelo, Texas. In addition, NRNW Fire and Emergency Services is coordinating to have his name added to the National Fallen Firefighter Memorial where they are honoring the pre-1981 LODD's with pavers along a special section of the Memorial walkway, currently under construction."

"In addition to communicating with the fire departments, the Port has done further research on the ability of local governments to lower the flag to half-mast and has determined it is an appropriate action. We apologize time did not allow us to thoroughly research protocol last year. It is the Port's intention to lower the flag to half-mast on January 24 in memory of your father, Vernon K. Fletcher, and his ultimate sacrifice.

Now the outcome of that is, "he will be blessed in what he does."

Scripture was meant to be taken seriously. The Bible can and will make a difference in the way people behave. But we must not merely listen to the word, but "do what it says." Scripture was never intended to be restrictive and binding, but to give freedom,...and bless one's life.

For our own self-evaluations, three questions come to mind...

- Am I setting aside ample time for in-depth Bible study?
- Am I holding on to what I am gaining from my Bible study?
- Am I putting into practice what I am learning from my Bible study?

So, how are you doing? If you have not found the freedom the "perfect law" gives, if you are not being "blessed" in what you do, try this....

- 1. Set aside some time to study a select passage of Scripture. Since we are discussing James here, focus on James 1:2-18. Read it carefully. Study it deeply. Seek to understand exactly what James is saying and how it should be applied.
- 2. Hold on to what you have learned. Meditate upon it as you go about your day. Try to see the events and circumstances of life through new eyes, clarified by your study.
- 3. Then, deliberately and consciously put into practice what you've just learned from Scripture.

Try it! Be serious about it! I think you'll find a blessing!
