I want my children to have it better than Barbara and I did. I don't want them to have the financial struggles we did when we were first starting out. I don't want them to have to work as hard as I did when I was a milkman. I want something better for my children.

Since the birth of our nation every generation of Americans has looked forward to a better life than their parents had. Each succeeding generation was better educated, more affluent, gained a shorter and shorter work week, increased pay and more employee benefits. In addition to that, all kinds of new inventions flooded the market. Life and work continued to get easier and better.

Today, however, things are different. No longer can children expect to have it better than their parents. This is about as good as it gets! The tide has turned. Our children probably aren't going to be any better off than we.

Except maybe in one area...spirituality!

I remember the struggles my Mom and Dad went through trying to figure out how and when to have regular family Bible study and prayer. Barabara and I have had the same struggle. But I think it has been a bit easier for us that it was for them. And I hope my children find it even easier.

My children grew up going to Bible School every Sunday and Wednesday. They were accustomed to having groups and individuals coming to our home regularly to Bible study. The kids they knew best were children from church. Activities of the church youth group set the primary dates on their calendars. Our younger ones were attending Bible camp before they were old enough to care. And they've all had a variety of Bible Camp experiences. Plus they've participated in a huge number of youth rallies, teen devotionals, TLCS at GNEW, and FaithOuests.

All of these were aimed at giving our children a spiritual advantage! These events and activities still have the same goal! Through them our young people are being taught to study their Bibles, to pray, to think, to feel, to worship, to enjoy spiritual relationships. I am seeing in many of our children today a spiritual maturity far beyond my own at

Food Workers Cards

If you have an interest in working in the church kitchen to provide food for service opportunities in the community, it would be helpful to take the Washington online course for food workers at www.foodworkercard.wa.gov You may also borrow a copy of the WA State Food and Beverage Workers' Manual from the church office to study for the online exam. Food workers cards cost \$10 and last for 2 years. The online course is presented in an audio-visual format and takes about 20 minutes. After the course and when you are ready, you have the option to take the exam online in order to get a card. The online exam is presented in the same format as the online course. You do not have to have a card to participate in events. Cards are printed by you after passing the exam. Please provide the office with a copy of your card to keep on file.
