

The Manger and the Cross



God does not need to intervene in creation, because God has never been absent from creation."

Often times we focus, rightly, on the death of Christ during the eucharist. We discuss the spiritual orientation and cultural situational logistics of the crucifixion. Christ's death is sometimes referred to as his greatest sacrifice, but his birth is equal in sentimentality in that he chose to separate himself from the total presence of God. As the early Church father, Origen, described the incarnation of Christ, "the word can also be a Son, in regard to his proclamation of the hidden things of the Father." So, in Christ's birth we are also given revelation of God's personhood. The sum of the circumstances surrounding the birth of Christ; being born of a shamed virgin, homeless, visited by the indigent and

the immigrant, and in the midst of regional infanticide allow us to recognize the types of people God works with and advocates for. It is within this context that we as a faith community are able to witness the demonstrative love the Godhead has for us.
