

Odd couples

This week I saw a documentary on different "odd couples." What this really meant was weird pairings of animals that had interspecies friends. Some of you may have been to the Zoo at one point and seen an exhibit with a cheetah and a dog for example. There were many of these friendships in the course of this show. Dogs making friends with almost anything that needed one, an old blind horse and an old goat, a tortoise and a goose, all of these and more.

As I watched this there was a part where the scientists were talking about the "natural" predator responses and how they can be overridden with experience. The pair they were referring to was a coyote and a lion. Both had been rescued as babies and were raised together. It struck me as odd that we seem to always build such ironclad rules and laws for how the world MUST behave.

We see a lion, and because it is one of the apex predators, we assume contrary to any new information or anecdotal evidence to the contrary, that is it a dangerous man-eating menace. Pitbulls have been almost completely eliminated as a family dog and are only now just coming out of the hard times they faced in the past years. Time and again we decide a rule on something based on faulty information.

What we see isn't always the best way for judging what is. Just because a lion is wild and untamed doesn't make it fit our boundaries of what it can or cannot do. Just because a dog is trained for fighting and abused until it uses lockjaw to win illegal fights, doesn't make the breed NOT an incredibly good family dog.

I think we are always perplexed by these stories because the world constantly tries to sell us the belief that "seeing is believing." When Christ came he used many different tools to help explain how the world and all its rules were not how God intended. Many times in the gospels he is seen with those whom are "farthest" from holy and he communes with them. He chooses disciples who are washed out of religious study, and he heals those who are unsafe to touch.

Going through Romans, Paul tells us to not take too high of a consideration of ourselves. To remain humble, to associate with those whom society has forgotten or detests. Time and again our experience is put on the shelf where it can gather dust as we are asked to accept the improbable and outright impossible.

However we are a people who proclaim a God who has died and risen. We are a people who preach the healing of contagious people through touch. We are called to be the people who look each other in the eyes, to uplift the homeless, to feed the hungry and to clothe the poor.

This week, spend some time thinking about what claims Jesus makes that you question in your daily walk with God, that you try to contextualize or separate yourself from, and pray that God changes your experience and perspective. Pray that God shows you His will for you in this deceptive world. May you be blessed as you seek to bless His children.
