Coffee Oasis is a <u>faith-based</u>, non-profit organization that exists to change the world for homeless youth one of which is here in Port Orchard.

Here at Port Orchard Church of Christ we have an opportunity to provide the homeless youth in our area with warm outerwear along with personal hygiene items. They can also use sleeping bags and tents. From now until November 17^{th} , Bonnie Mitchell will be collecting the following items to fill tote bags for the homeless youth. It is stated that on a Friday night they serve about 50 homeless teenagers at Coffee Oasis – a program that we participate in here at POCOC.

The tote bags will be furnished. Following is the list of items for the bags. Without the hat, gloves and scarves the cost (at Dollar Tree) comes to about \$12.00. My goal is to fill at least 25 but 50 would be AWESOME! (Just like POCOC community is.) (Yes I am schmoozing a bit hoping to hit your heart strings.) I have requested that those who knit or crochet donate hats, gloves, or scarves for the bags. However, these are items that can also be purchased. If preferred money donations to fill the bags is welcome.
