HONORABLE VESSEL!

In order to fill a container with something, there must be room inside. If it is full, more cannot be added. If what is within is what ought to be, then it is good. However, if what is within ought to be replaced with something better, the willingness to do so should arise. As this is true with boxes, bottles, canisters, and other containers, it is also true with life. Someone has noted that God cannot fill us when we are full of ourselves.

When life is all about us, it becomes self-serving; based on our own personal desires. However, when our life is duly handed over to God, it becomes about doing His Will and glorifying Him! As we humble ourselves before God it is He Who then lifts us up. (James 4:10) By dying to self, our life becomes more of the Lord (i.e. Galatians 2:20) and our focus not only takes into consideration His interests, but also the interests of others. What marks the quality of the content of our life?

Writing to Timothy, Paul exhorted. . . "Now in a great house there are not only vessels of gold and silver but also of wood and clay, some for honorable use, some for dishonorable. Therefore, if anyone cleanses himself from what is dishonorable, he will be a vessel for honorable use, set apart as holy, useful to the master of the house, ready for every good work." (2 Timothy 2:20-21 ESV)

Cleansed as a "vessel for honorable use", it is then that our life becomes most useful for our Master's purposes and thus we are prepared for every good work into which He leads us. Recognizing how Jesus was willing to empty Himself on our behalf and serve the Father's Will (Philippians 2:7-8), may we follow in His steps and so be filled with His essence that like Him, we will fulfill our God given purpose on earth.
