Of course we couldn't do that the night the power went out, so we opted for candles and chocolate instead. However, this lights out incident reminded me of an episode of a show we watch. One of the characters in the show gets lost in his newly purchased house when the power goes out and his father-in-law knows the layout perfectly. Instead of fixing the problem himself, he gets on the house inter-
