ext week on Wednesday the 7th we'll venture out to meet our neighbors, face to face. We will meet them where they are and introduce ourselves. We will do our best to find out about the things that matter to them and what concerns they have for the neighborhood and what concerns they have in their lives.

We will meet at the building at 4:30pm, split into pairs at 4:40pm and receive our supplies. At 4:55pm we will pray together and at 5pm we'll head out. Lord willing we will knock on doors until 7pm.

It will get dark and it might rain so come prepared for that; a flashlight or headlamp and something to keep you and your feet dry. Scribes you may want an umbrella. Many of us have never done this sort of thing before and we've been blessed to have some veterans offer to join us. We will go out in teams of two, one doorknocker and one scribe (who will do their best to record what our neighbors tell us). We will go out with a list of addresses, some questions, and a postcard that we'll have our info on it along with a link for an online survey to tell us more if they want to. We will leave this same postcard for those folks we are unable to talk with.

In addition our Wednesday evening prayer meeting next week, on the 7th, will begin at 5pm instead of 6pm so that we may cover those going out and the neighborhood with prayer. If you aren't able to participate in the door knocking please consider attending the prayer meeting. For those who've never attended a Wednesday evening, it starts with a prayer walk (for those who are able) around the property and then continues inside the auditorium with additional prayer time. If you just can't get out at all please be in prayer wherever you find yourself during that time. Finally, if the Spirit moves you begin praying now, there can never be too much!
