

Don't Let the Busyness of the Season Crowd Out What's Most Important

"But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." Matthew 6:33

Just a few weeks before Christmas, maybe life seems kind of full and busy. Maybe you haven't finished Christmas shopping yet. Or that special gift you've been looking for is officially out of stock, or costs too much money. Maybe the decorations never got fully done, or the lights are already burning out.

Maybe the Christmas cards are still waiting to be mailed. And the to-do list is steadily growing day by day. Maybe life is feeling frazzled and time always seems too short...to finish it all. But truth says, maybe what we spend so much time focusing on, really isn't the most important. Here's what is:

Yet if we recognize our need for God, spend time with Him, relying on His strength, He is faithful. He's got our back. He knows our way. We can walk with His blessing and favor, we can live in His peace, and be filled with His joy which is our strength.
