This week, I heard a conversation about how one person felt that when they were being watched by other people, they would have more integrity because they felt the pressure or responsibility to. The conversation was positive and appreciative of the opportunity to lead others, but it was received negatively by me.

I grew up learning right from wrong just like anyone else's parents try to teach them. It is something I wrestle with constantly to be consistent with my words and my actions, but of course I'm not perfect and I make mistakes. Everybody has those days. However, it does not become an excuse when I make the wrong decision. Integrity leads us to own our mistakes and learn from them. When I

was pondering this specific train of thought, something Paul teaches Peter in 1 Peter 3 v 13-16 came to mind:

"Who is going to harm you if you are eager to do good? But even if you should suffer for what is right, you are blessed. "Do not fear their threats; do not be frightened."But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander."

We are taught to "always be ready" and "keep a clear conscience." This is integrity that we followers of Jesus must develop, regardless of leadership. Will we always get it right? Of course not. Did Jesus ask us to "be perfect?" Yes. Did he *really mean that*?
