William "Les" Lewis

William "Les" Lewis passed away Dec. 23, 2018 in Houston. He was born July 21, 1934 in Cleburne to the late William Henry and Flossie Mae Lewis. Les retired after serving 38 years as a Senior Chief in the US Navy. He also worked as a tax preparer for 29 years, and was a member of the NAEA, NATP, and WATP. He was also a licensed funeral director and embalmer. He served as an elder at four different churches, and was a member of the South Main Church of Christ in Henderson, Texas.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by two sisters, Freda Padel and Earlene Anderson. Survivors include: his wife of 63 years, Len Lewis of Henderson; children, Margie Brown and husband Keith of Gary, Bill Lewis and wife Raquel of St. James, MO, Bob Lewis of Arlington, and Alex Lewis and wife Joely of Lincoln, NE; nine grandchildren, 14 great-grandchildren, and two great-great-grandchildren.

And I can tell you that there was a lot more to this Lord's servant than most members got to see. Les was not perfect, and in fact described himself as a "dry drunk", meaning that while he did not drink

alcohol, he had many of the personality disfunctions that an alcoholic would exhibit (due to past experiences). But Les knew Christ and was confident in His ability to make all things for good.

Following Christ's example, Les worked tirelessly to aid people in the congregation, and outside. He prepared many tax returns, refusing to accept a fee or even a gratuity from members. And, you may not believe this, but Les was often the "pro" voice in elder discussions about possible new ministries. While others (including myself) were questioning if we should try something, Les had the faith that if it were God's plan, it would work.

I miss the quiet times with Les, as he would talk about his past experiences. His coming into the shipyard in the spring and taking a ferry to Annapolis to find a worship service. Meeting a young lady that first week, going home with her parents for a meal. And her father (Willard Hoover) sitting him down and laying out the expectations if he were to become their son-in-law (and this was on the day they met!) It must have worked, because when Les's ship left the shipyard in the fall, Helen ("Len") elected to marry him, and go to his next duty station rather than attend college as previously arranged.

So many other things come to mind, but in the end Les wasn't perfect. He was FORGIVEN. And now he walks with God, basking in the glorious eternal Sonshine!
