

### **Update from Roy Merritt**

Perhaps you have been hearing scary stories about our rain. The season began normally in mid-November and lasted about two weeks, then faded out and we had very little rainfall in December. Villagers who planted very early lost their crop. First two weeks of January we had night time or early morning drizzles that revived the later crops, and those who had lost their crops planted again. We have not had rain now for about ten days. Crops still look good, and the maize in the farther field is already tasseling.



Old-time missionary, Alvin Hobby was quite the astronomer, and he said most of our rain comes the week before and the week after the full moon. That was the pattern of the early January rain, so I hope we soon get another two weeks of good rain.



But we really need some heavy rain to fill our streams so they fill our dams and stockponds. And even the Zambezi River and Lake Kariba, our main source of electrical power in Zambia. In a **normal** rainy season, this small stream flowing through Namwianga would be gurgling now.

At least the countryside is a beautiful green.



And the water level in this stockpond would be three quarters of the way up on the reeds waaaay over there on the other side.



There are virtually no flowers, but I find the occasional snail or tortoise hustling along -- though they are not interested in conversation. I am seeing lots of tracks made by giant beetles. I keep hoping I can see one some morning and get a photo for you. They are very dark brown, slow movers, and nearly as big as a softball!



#### PLEASE KEEP OUR RAIN SITUATION IN YOUR PRAYERS.

Another crop failure for the village folk will be a disaster even worse than the drought we had in 2019. Please ask our Lord to have mercy on these humble, lovely, gentle people. - Roy Merritt

## **Reflections...**

Ken Avery gave the message Sunday, January 26, 2020 - It was about 3 stories that were taught and touched by the Master.

First, in John 3:1-17 it's the story of Jesus washing the disciples' feet. Their feet were washed by the Son of God. - <u>Jesus' humility</u>.

Second, John 8:1-11 is Jesus, and the woman caught in adultery. Jesus saved her life, physically – spiritually, He gave her a chance to repent. - Jesus' mercy.

The third story is from John 4, Jesus talks with the Samaritan woman at the well. There are invisible lines in the sand at the well. – Religious, cultural, racial and gender lines – Jesus crossed all those lines. He crossed them because He was concerned for her soul. Jesus didn't sin by talking to the woman, and He didn't sin when He talked to the Samaritan people from the town. They saw someone who saw them and loved them. - Jesus' grace.
