

Responding to God Right Now, by Tiffany Rousseau

Did you know that the "altar call" was a practice made popular by American Methodist preachers in the 1800s to determine who responded to hearing the gospel with joy? It's true.

I went to a church that had an altar call every week and I went to a church that asked you to respond individually during the praise that followed the sermon. Whatever way we respond to the Holy

"Anglican churches featured an altar in front of the communion table, and ministers often encouraged parishioners to come to the altar if they needed prayer or encouragement. Methodist preachers inherited this tradition but changed its purpose, calling rather those "under conviction" to come forward to the altar. In 1801, for example, itinerant Methodist preacher Peter Cartwright told women at a camp meeting that if they promised "to pray to God for religion," they might take a seat at the altar. Cartwright further accused parents who discouraged their children from "going to the altar" of hindering their salvation." - Christianity Today

Recently, I've heard members of our congregation wonder why we don't ask for an altar call on a regular basis. I don't doubt that people are asking out of curiosity or out of conviction, but I question the reason.

Why is it some of us desire an altar call? It's not something Paul practices in the bible. It's not something Jesus asks us to do. If one of us feels led to follow Christ or respond to the message, what does an altar call do for us that the Holy Spirit cannot?

I went to a church that had an altar call every week and I went to a church that asked you to respond individually during the praise that followed the sermon. Whatever way we respond to the Holy Spirit after hearing a teaching on Sunday is up to us, not to the preacher, to initiate. If the Holy Spirit is burning inside you, stand up and say something. Sunday gathering is not a time for restricting the spirit, it's a time to listen to it and follow its lead.

I know that Cody and James have done what God has led them to do each Sunday because these men are servants of the Most High King, men who have given their lives to serve God however he calls them. They are offering their very best and teaching with humble and contemplative hearts. Each week they encourage us to listen to their message, hear God's lesson for ourselves in it, and to respond. They always offer a way to respond and the front of the church is always open for you to respond to.

But so is the back. So is the prayer room. Outside in nature is great too. New people, older people, family, friends, and all are invited to respond to Christ's call in their lives each Sunday, with or without an "altar call."

Meditate on this this week and consider what is holding you back from responding to God RIGHT NOW. Identify what it is within you restricting your forward momentum as a follower of Jesus, pray that God removes that spiritual hurdle, and step.
