

Defining Love

not only defined love, He raised the bar by instructing His disciples to love one another.

Jesus stated: "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this, all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35) In this new command, Jesus calls disciples to practice genuine love. However, He did not just talk about this authentic love; He demonstrated the qualities and actions that typify genuine love.

One of Jesus' most memorable acts of loving selflessly was washing the disciples' feet. "He poured water into the basin, and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel girding his waist. So He came to Simon Peter. He said to Him, 'Lord, do You wash my feet?' Jesus answered and said to him, 'What I do you do not realize now, but you will understand hereafter." (John 13:5-7)

The washing of feet was an act of service typically accomplished by a servant. Knowing this, Jesus humbles Himself and serves those who should have been serving Him, thus demonstrating loving humility.

Jesus goes on to further show this new definition of love by living his teaching regarding the treatment of one's enemies. Scripture

details the events and treatment of Jesus after His arrest. The Romans tortured, humiliated and disrespected Him in every way. Finally, they nailed his hands and feet to a cross. After enduring such inhumane treatment, Jesus demonstrates merciful love by asking God the Father to forgive the ones who were inflicting this incredible pain that would eventually take his life.

When they came to the place called The Skull, there they crucified Him and the criminals, one on the right and the other on the left. But Jesus was saying, 'Father, forgive them; for they do not know what they are doing.' (Luke 23:33-34)

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus presciently addresses this type of behavior:

But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven; for He causes His sun to rise on the evil and the good and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? If you greet only your brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? Therefore you are to be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect. (Matthew 5:44-48)
