Do What You Can

Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." (Acts 3:6)

As Peter and John are about to go into the temple at the hour of prayer, they encounter a lame man begging alms from those entering the temple. (Acts 3:1-11). Peter had no silver or gold to give but he did what he could by using what he did have and gave the lame man a far greater gift than silver and gold. Peter saw the need and did what he could! There is a powerful lesson for you and I to learn from this event. I know that we can do no miracles like Peter did on that occasion but we can have, yea must have, the same attitude of doing what we can do as a child of God to be a blessing to others.

I know and understand that we cannot earn our way to eternal life in heaven (Eph. 2:8-9) But the same man who wrote Ephesians 2:8-9 also wrote Philippians 2:12. "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling." Then I hear James as he says, "faith without works is dead, show me your faith without works and I will show you my faith by my works" (James 2:17-18).

Turning to Matthew 5:16 we find the Lord placing upon us a duty, a responsibility in which there is no choice: "Let your light shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father who is in heaven." Letting our light shine requires a total commitment to some great passages from God's word such as Matthew 6:33; 1 Timothy 4:12; 2 Timothy 2:15; 2 Peter 3:18; Colossians. 3:1-2; Matthew. 6:19-21; Romans 12:1-2; 1 Corinthians 15:58; Galatians 6:10; 1 Peter 1:22 and Mark 12:30-31. It is my firm conviction that if we are willing to follow the example of the Macedonians in 2 Corinthians 8:5 we will have no difficulty in letting our lights shine through a total commitment to the Lord. It is unthinkable that we should live in this world and not be like that city set on a hill (Matt. 5:14).

I pray we all understand that we teach others by the way we live! We do not, yea cannot, live without having some influence on other people. Do what you can to influence people to love, honor, obey, serve and glorify God (1 Corinthians 6:19-20).
