Darrell & Laura are quick to respond to calls for assistance, whether it be a ride, a place to stay, or a financial need. Folks are still working at the warming Center, headed by Jim and Cindy Snead, along with others who keep up that outreach. The meals at Coffee Oasis for homeless teens continues. Bible studies, prayer and leadership meetings continue virtually using phones, emails, texts, and Zoom. LaDonna Latham has continued paying the bills; and many of you have taken the time to check in on one another by various means. The list goes on.
