Dear Family,

So many have been involved in trying to safely get us back together for in person worship. The date is set November 1st I

Part of the requirements for faith-based organizations is to have a written plan that addresses many areas including the requirement to educate our staff and our members.

We have tried to put together a concise plan as well as have a complete binder of resources for our members and our body.

Our plan hopes to give each and every one of you information to help you make your personal choice whether to attend worship inside of our building, continue with audio (93.1 FM) from the parking lot, or live-stream via the internet.

As we move through the "in person, indoors" planning there may be changes or additions to the plan. As the state moves through the different phases that will also affect us and our activities.

We are implementing precautions not required such as temperature scan before entering. We also have installed Wave Air Purifiers; in addition, we have purchased a Disinfectant Atomizing Sprayer.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the deacons, SLT members or staff. It is our deepest desire to keep each and every one of you safe!

Educate:

Educate all employees/staff/ church members regarding virus prevention and regulations for assembly during Phase 2.

Video: Detail building Covid-19 safety operations during indoor use, emphasis on personal self-screening before gathering, safe distancing (6-ft min), mask, and usage of personal protection essentials; hand sanitizer and gloves provided throughout the building. *Prescreening with temperature check for all upon entrance*. Distribute video to individuals via the internet as well as post on church website.

Operations plan:

Covid-19 Specific safety practices and Washington Department of Labor and Industries general requirements and prevention ideas for Coronavirus. https://www.doh.wa.gov/Coronavirus/workplace

Covid-19 Supervisor: *Alternating*

Responsibilities: Monitor and enforce the Covid-19 safety plan

Posted signage on entrance door *mask required for entry*.

Any individual with a temperature of 100.4 F will not be permitted entrance or attendance. If any individual with a household member who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 or with symptoms of it may not attend the service.

Posters detailing symptoms posted on premises.

Keep a log of attendees at each service for at least two weeks for possible outbreaks.

Screen staff before each service, questionnaire and temperature check for signs and symptoms. Any individual with a temperature of 100.4 F will not be permitted entrance or attendance.

Face covering always, everywhere, everyone - unless working alone or live streaming with no live audience, this includes those leading or speaking during the service.

Provide PPE for staff and visitors if needed.

Six-foot separation between people, seats, and pews at all times.

Markings on floors and seats indicating 6-foot radius.

Tissues and trash cans inside and out.

Hand washing with adequate supplies available.

Hand sanitizers with greater than 70% alcohol.

Disinfectants available to everyone throughout the location, indoor and outdoor.

Supervisor designated at each location (indoor and out) to monitor health of staff and enforce safety plan.

Limit entrance and exit flow, row by row dismissal, guide by floor markings as well as roped que.

Communion dispensed by gloved individual to comply with no direct physical contact or communal plate. Tithe box available upon entrance to auditorium.

Restrooms: 2 people at a time, waiting people maintain 6" distance Signage on door. Special foot openers installed on restroom interior door to reduce surface contact.

Establish housekeeping schedule - emphasis on cleaning and sanitizing frequently touched surfaces.

Ventilation enhancements to prevent exposure.

Between services or building use for classes or other gatherings:

Clean and disinfect high-touch surfaces after each use of building, mirrors, chairs, headrests, armrests, doorknobs, handrails, restrooms, using soapy water, followed by appropriate disinfectants.

Incident response:

If staff or member have any symptoms or feel or appear sick, they must stay home or immediately go home. Cordon off any areas where such staff or member touched surfaces, worked, etc., until the area and equipment are cleaned and sanitized. Follow the cleaning guidelines set by the CDC to deep clean and sanitize.

An incident response form must be completed and provided to the Covid-19 Supervisor. Supervisor and their team will complete and document follow up with potential exposure contacts and the individual and or family member. Local health authorities will be contacted immediately for the testing and follow up. All CDC protocols will be followed.
