For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost (Luke 19:10)

We should be impressed and our hearts filled with gratitude to the Father who has made it possible for us to be a part of that church. As members of this body, we are the family of God and we are on our way home. Going home to a place where all tears will be wiped from our eyes and there will be no death, no mourning or crying or pain and everything will be made new (Rev. 21:3-5). As the family of God, we weep together and we rejoice together (Rom. 12:15) and, yes, we dream together of how it will be when we all get to heaven. How beautiful heaven must be and we can know that there is a place in it for us and it is made possible because the Son of man came into this world to seek and to save the lost. Choose to obey the gospel and be saved (Rom. 10:17; James 1:21); choose not to obey and be lost (2 Thess. 1:7-9). Choose to be in Christ and be saved (Acts 4:12; 1 Thess. 5:9-10).

What a priceless blessing it is to be a child of God (Rom. 8:16-17). I pray God's love and tender mercy will surround you all the days of the rest of your life on this earth and though I may never meet many of you on this side of eternity, hopefully, one day we will meet just inside that city.
