#### The 10-code

**Ten-codes**, officially known as **ten signals**, are <u>brevity codes</u> used to represent common phrases in voice communication. Originally developed during 1937 - 1940 to reduce use of speech on the radio at a time when police radio channels were limited. Ten-codes, especially "10-4" (meaning "understood" or "ok") first reached public recognition in the mid- to late-1950s through the popular television series <u>*Highway Patrol*</u>, with <u>Broderick Crawford</u>. Crawford would reach into his patrol car to use the <u>microphone</u> to answer a call and precede his response with "10-4".

Ten-codes were adapted for use by <u>CB radio</u> enthusiasts. <u>C. W. McCall</u>'s hit song "<u>Convoy</u>" (1975), depicting conversation among CB-communicating <u>truckers</u>, put phrases like "10-4" and "what's your twenty?" (10-20 for "where are you?") into common use in American English.

This Sunday is 10-4 Sunday (October 4). This is a reminder for me that when I feel God urging me to serve in any way, my answer should be... will be "10-4". - Jon Powless
