FINDING THE PEARL!

It has been said, "If an oyster can make a pearl out of an irritating grain of sand, just think what you could do if in every situation you chose to rejoice!" (shared by Tom Green) In Paul's letter to the church at Rome we read. . .

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God. Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us." (Romans 5:1-5)



To rejoice in hope may perhaps be easy. In the face of life's challenges, hope can still give rise to rejoicing. However, to rejoice in sufferings is something else. In order to do this the focus must move from the suffering to what the life is being moved toward in spite of it. This moves the focus away from suffering as a stop sign or roadblock to recognizing it as merely part of the pathway leading forward. As ability to endure is strengthened and character is developed, the hopefulness of also sense increases. These are pearls of

great value! However, another pearl in going though trials is that in the process of the agitation, we are step-by-step becoming more and more like Christ Who also experienced joy in the face of suffering (Hebrews 12:2) knowing what would be provided for us through what He endured on our behalf. In the midst of peril may we look for the pearl being produced through the process!
