Forgiveness

Forgiveness is different from condoning, excusing, forgetting, pardoning, and reconciliation. Forgiveness is yours to give. You can choose to keep it or not. You may feel that the offense was too great, that they must pay for what they did.

How many times have we been a witness to or the subject of the need of forgiveness? The church is one place where we are not to withhold forgiveness. We have many warnings about the danger of not forgiving. When we withhold forgiveness from a brother or sister, we risk losing our forgiveness from God

Matt 6:14-15 reads, "If you forgive others the wrongs they have done to you, your Father in heaven will also forgive you. But if you do not forgive others, then your Father will not forgive the wrongs you have done."

In Matt, 18 Peter asked Jesus how many times should I forgive, seven times? Jesus replied seventy times seven. Jesus teaches us to follow Him. We are to love others as He has loved us. Jesus has the authority to forgive, it is His to give, and He gives forgiveness freely.

He, knowing what would happen, went to the cross for us, in order that we should be forgiven. It is an act that releases the guilty party from the transgression. In the cross, we are freed from our sin and given new life. We are pardoned. It is as if we never sinned. This forgiveness allows us access to God through prayer. We can enter the throne room of God and lay our hearts at His feet.

If Jesus can forgive us for a lifetime of sin, why do we struggle to forgive an insult? I know there are things that happen in this world that are unimaginable, and we think, there is no way that I can forgive yet, that is what we are called to do. Just as God desires to restore a broken relationship with man, we are to restore our relationships with each other. How can we hold a grudge against a brother or sister and still offer our worship to God?

Remember, forgiveness is ours to give. Even if the offender does not ask to be forgiven, we can forgive. If we have been holding onto a grudge. We may need to be the one to ask for forgiveness. Often, the offense we hold onto was not intentional, but we do not take the time or ask the questions needed. Rather, we allow sin to take root in us and more often than not, spread to others.

Forgiveness is such a large topic in the bible because it is an important aspect to our lives. We are called to unity; we are called to relationship with one another. Something miraculous happens when we forgive and are forgiven. Remember, forgiveness is an action. It is releasing the offender, letting go of the hurt and looking at them as if the offense never happened.

That is how God looks at us. If we walk in the light as He is in the light. It is as if we never sinned. Jesus paid the price to forgive us. He declared us innocent of guilt. We must also forgive ourselves and not allow guilt to take root in us. Forgiveness is ours to give even to ourselves.

I am reminded of many narratives from scripture where forgiveness was given.

- Think about Joseph and his brothers. They sold him into slavery, and he was imprisoned but when his brothers came for help in the famine. Joseph forgave them saying, "what you meant for evil God used for good." Could you forgive your brothers if they sold you?
- Esau forgave Jacob for stealing the birthright and blessing, then welcomed him and his family back. Could you forgive your brother for stealing from you?
- Jesus forgave the angry mob for placing Him on the cross. Can you forgive your brother or sister?

Do not let another day go by withholding forgiveness from another or yourself. Allow the blessing of forgiveness to restore relationships and to bring honor to God.
