Growing up there was a song our congregation sang called "People Need the Lord." That song has been on my mind as I've transitioned back to the secular business world. Every day I'm among thousands of people. I'm around hundreds of employees. Every day I think of that song and how true it is. I know I need Jesus because I'm flawed and weak and need a Savior. I know others do too.

The past few weeks God has given me opportunities to care about people. I've been able to watch, listen, and empathize. I've been hearing their stories and some have broken my heart with compassion.

One lady about 20 years my senior I met in training said she prayed to God asking for Him to send her someone who could talk to her about changing her life. She sat next to me in orientation and I was the one person she talked to and asked if she could have my number if she had questions since we are going through the same program. She contacted me and I've helped her with some issues and she said she cried when she found out I have Christian counseling credentials.

One of the most exciting stories was after work one day one of employees stopped me and asked as a man of faith what my opinion was on something. He said he had been struggling with something that he read in the Bible. He asked, "I was sprinkled as a baby, but I'm an adult with my own faith, do I have to be baptized to be saved?" That led to an amazing spiritual conversation. That conversation made my week.

There was a young man that worked there for a while. My first week I showed him something to make his life easier that I literally learned earlier that day. I told him I believe in him and was proud of him. He stopped and paused and he told me that no one in his life has ever told him that. That is sad. After work he told me he struggles with spirituality cause he's an apathetic Mormon and feels it's just about rules and looking good. It was a chance to talk about grace, relationship, and humility to confess like the publican from the Bible.

There was a lady who works very hard in our store. I wrote her a thank you card. She said that the card made her cry because she had never received anything like that while working there. She said it meant more because she had Thanksgiving alone.

A young lady in our store walked up to me while I was eating my lunch. She just poured out her life story of her hard childhood and that she wanted to know if life could be better. That broke my heart as she was looking for hope.

An employee of mine was having car problems and he came to work early because he walked to work and left extra early to make sure he didn't be late to work. Throughout the day he was on my mind. I went and asked him what time he gets off. He was getting off after 10pm like I was that day. I asked him if I could give him a ride home because he was going to have to wait an hour for the bus and then another period of time on the bus. He knew I had an hour drive home. So, I drove him home and we were able to have a great talk. He was teary eyed that someone would offer him a ride. He now finds me out and gives me a fist bump each day.

Today I had a talk with a young man. He felt comfortable enough to tell me that he failed out of college and that he was depressed without a feeling of purpose. He told me his dad died when he was a young kid and had no male role model. He said he felt suicidal years ago and that experience taught him to be more compassionate and patient to criticize others. This led to a great conversation.

I say all this because going back to the secular world I'm around people who need the Lord. This experience is helping me see that even more again and my heart breaks and goes out to them. I know I'm powerless to really do what they need in life, but Jesus, the Holy One and the compassionate servant leader can!

I encourage you all to take time to truly see people. Hear their stories. Let your heart be touched. Let your hands serve. Let God work and work through you for His glory and His glory alone!

We are surrounded by hurting people with real life issues, struggles, problems, and needs. We are the ones who have the saving message of grace that could save, heal, and strengthen their lives and open up eternity in relationship with Jesus!

We know what it is like to need Jesus. We needed Him before coming to Him. We need Him now through life even though we are Christians. We aren't perfect and we are in continual need of grace, forgiveness, compassion, and love. We need the Lord! So, remember everyone around you needs the Lord. Therefore, do not waste the opportunities and the influence God has given you to love people one step closer to Christ!

Many of our homebound seniors who we provide meals for never have any interaction other than our drivers who deliver their meals to them.

At Meals on Wheels Kitsap (MOWK), we are putting together holiday bags for all of them. Included will be Christmas cards signed by our volunteers and others who would like to participate.

Just knowing someone took the time to acknowledge them with a card does tremendous things to brighten what could be a very lonely and depressing Christmas.
