As we look at the minor prophets we see how over and over the prophets spoke both good and bad news. The prophets would call the people of Israel and Judah to repentance as they slowly became like the people around them, the outsiders. In some cases, God's people even turned their backs on their own God. Judah became distracted, gave their hearts over to other gods, and lost their focus. Micah calls judgment down on the people and calls them to repentance. It is a "yo-yo" of activity throughout the book of Micah as he calls down words of "warning and judgment" as well as words of "comfort and hope" on Judah.

It is a yo-yo we don't want to be a part of as people—or as God's people. The good news is that Micah ends the book with a message of hope.

"Who is a God like you, who pardons sin and forgives the transgression of the remnant of his inheritance? You do not stay angry forever but delight to show mercy. You will again have compassion on us; you will tread our sins underfoot and hurl all our iniquities into the depths of the sea." (Micah 7:18-19).

Isn't it great news that we serve a God who pardons sin and forgives transgression? Isn't it great news that we serve a God who shows mercy? Isn't it great that we serve a God who will hurl our iniquities into the bottom of the sea! Let this good news propel us to love our God with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength. May it also propel us to go forth and love our neighbor as ourselves.
