"Turn away from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it." (Psalm 34:14)

Often, what we need to hear is not elusive or complex. It is simple, just like the words above. Turn away from evil. Do good. Seek peace.

We have no problem understanding these instructions. We agree with every word. The challenge is in living them out every minute and every hour of every day. When we do, and our actions match our beliefs, we will be blessed.

Peace is something we desire, but how do we obtain it? We sometimes view receiving peace as some magical transaction that we either got or didn't. The truth is that we often lack peace because we are making choices that keep us from it. We are not pursuing it as we should.

- If we choose to hate someone, then we are allowing that hatred to destroy our peace.
- If we are not content, then discontentment will make having peace impossible.
- If we choose anger, then we will lack peace.
- If we choose to be offended by the actions of others, then we miss out on our own peace of mind.
- If we neglect to do good to others, then we are not pursuing a life of peace.

If something is not right in your life, then try the simple instructions that God gives. The path to peace is not a secret. Turn away from evil. Do what is right. Tell the truth. Do good. Bless others. Be kind. Seek peace. Practice these things and take note of how your life changes. Choosing the way of God is a blessing.
