Rooted and Fruitful!

It has been noted, "People who brag about their ancestors are like carrots -- the best part of them is underground." [source: calendar quote]

Though we may have a rich heritage providing the blessing of a godly foundation for our life, we still must remain mindful of our own life choices, the manner in which we are presently living, and what our life is producing. In John 8, Jesus encountered some who boasted of Abraham being their father (John 8:39) and therefore felt no need of being set free from anything (John 8:33), while Jesus noted their actions revealed they were actually children of the devil. (John 8:44) Though as Jews they had a rich ancestry behind them (John 8:37), they were not living in a like manner of Abraham. (John 8:39) Therefore, in view of their life, it appears the best part was buried underground.

Now, I love carrots and they are good for us. Though what is above ground might be a nice shade of green, it is true the best part is underground. However, with dahlias, the best part is above ground. The root (the tubers) from which they grow are significant, but not as impressive as the many variations of blossoms produced. It is not possible to have the beautiful flowers without the roots, but it is the beautiful flowers which reveal fruitful life exists!

This reminds me of a message of hope to Israel from the prophet Isaiah during the days of King Hezekiah where we read. . . "And the surviving remnant of the house of Judah shall again take root downward and bear fruit upward." (2 Kings 19:30 ESV) [Isaiah 37:31]

Though there had been wickedness in the past, there would be a renewal of fruitfulness as Hezekiah had been instrumental in leading the focus of the nation back toward God. Once again properly rooted downward they would bear fruit upward.

What about our own life? Even if we have been blessed with a godly ancestry, like Timothy (i.e. 2 Timothy 1:5), the life of faith must become our own to embrace and produce fruit. In this regard, may you join me in the plea to God, "Lord, make me a dahlia!"

PHILIPPIANS 1:20-30

I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. If I am to go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labor for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body. Convinced of this, I know that I will remain, and I will continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith, so that through my being with you again your boasting in Christ Jesus will abound on account of me.

Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. Then, whether I come and see you or only hear about you in my absence, I will know that you stand firm in the one Spirit, striving together as one for the faith of the gospel without being frightened in any way by those who oppose you. This is a sign to them that they will be destroyed, but that you will be saved—and that by God. For it has been granted to you on behalf of Christ not only to believe in him, but also to suffer for him, since you are going through the same struggle you saw I had, and now hear that I still have.

Therefore, if you have any encouragement from being united with Christ, if any comfort from his love, if any common sharing in the Spirit, if any tenderness and compassion, then make my joy complete by being like-minded, having the same love, being one in spirit and of one mind. Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit. Rather, in humility value others above yourselves, not looking to your own interests but each of you to the interests of the others.
