The countdown at a space launch creates a moment of heightened excitement as all observers focus on the very dangerous and exciting moment of igniting the powerful booster rockets. Everyone's attention is captured and focused on that one location.

The final kick generated by a runner attempting to win the race causes all observers to lean into that moment anticipating the final victory at the finish line.

The anticipation in the final few moments before an important event heightens the heart rate, intensifies the senses and increases our breath rate. We tend to forget many of the periphery issues that demand our attention. The miniscule worries of day-to-day concerns melt into obscurity.

When our life is on the edge of eternity, we think of only a few things of importance. We think of relationships and human commitments. We forget about our owed bills and odd jobs left undone. We prioritize our statements to others and consider last minute duties. In Jesus' final gathering with his followers just before his arrest and crucifixion he prepared for the evening Passover meal saying, "My time is at hand." Matthew 26:18

How empowering it is when we know that "our time is at hand." If we all could know such a definitive moment in our life then we would focus our efforts and statements to those who need it the most. We wouldn't waste so much time treating the important as trivial.

We would prepare and prioritize attempting to maximize our moments. We would stop making irrational decisions and rightly consider our steps.

David wrote in Psalm 90:12 "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." A heart of wisdom will direct our path, helping us to focus on the important and filter out the trivial. May God lead us all to know that our time is at hand!
