

### **Eight Considerations For Easter Sunday**

I hope you are in prayer about inviting friends and family to Easter Sunday! It is possible we will have many guests that day. There will be some people you don't know. Some of them are guests. Others are members who attend infrequently. You have an opportunity to make a gospel impression on these people with a few simple acts - acts that can make an eternal difference. Here are some servant actions for you to consider.

- 1. Pray as you enter the property. Pray for the guests. Pray for the services. Pray for the ministers and the sermon.
- Park at the most distant spot available. Save closer parking for guests.
- 3. Greet people. It's okay to introduce yourself!
- 4. Look for people to help. You know the place well. Many others will not. Be a guide. Help someone who looks like he or she needs help.
- 5. Sit as close as possible to the front of the auditorium. Save the back rows for guests so they don't have to walk past so many people. And sit closely. After all, we ARE here to encourage one another in faith!
- 6. Fully engage in worship. Sing out loud. Open your Bibles. Pay close attention to each element of worship. Demonstrate to guests and one another that this is a moment of importance.
- Volunteer to serve. As the number of attendees increase, so does the need for volunteers. The greeting team, children's church, and kids Sunday School ministries are a few of the areas that will need more volunteers to help serve and minister to members and guests.
- 8. Pray as you leave. The Holy Spirit is likely working in many persons who attended. Pray for His continual work of conviction and comfort.
- 9. Consider ahead of time what you can do to make visiting this church a friendly and enjoyable experience!

### Granberg Lodge Update

The repair and restoration of Granberg Lodge is on our hearts and minds. We have completed the removal and reinstallation of our electrical and HVAC systems in the lodge and are now awaiting a permit to finish the rest of this project.

Though the board is optimistic, we wanted to let you know that there is a chance that our permit will not be approved in time because of the extent of the damage, repair, and new requirements to bring the Granberg Lodge up to code. If the lodge is not repaired in time, we will not be able to host camps this summer. The board of directors has set a date of May 7th, as the date which we will determine whether we are proceeding with camps. Following the board meeting that morning, we will send out communication about our decision. We know that our volunteers and campers have set aside vacations, arranged schedules, and eagerly await camp. We are doing everything in our power to make camp happen.

We have submitted a letter of hardship asking for the county to work with us to get our facility back up and running as soon as possible. Please pray that this process goes smoothly and that all our camps will happen this year and every year to come.
