Story: Introduction to the Christian Worldview class

I've done it, and so have you: We borrowed someone else's prescription eyeglasses and found our vision quickly distorted—our vison of reality changed radically! Our worldview is the "pair of glasses" we look through to see our world. We need to examine whose "glasses" we are wearing – uncritically borrowing someone else's "glasses" can lead to a distorted vision of reality! How does a biblical worldview contrast with the worldviews common in the secular society in which we live? Let's be sure not to wear someone else's eyeglass prescription –nor their worldview.

This accredited three semester hour college freshman level course is offered on Tuesday evenings, Sept 27-Dec. 13 from 6-9 PM, plus four hours one Saturday. The course will meet at the Lakeview Church of Christ in Tacoma. The course is offered through the Northwest School of Discipleship of the Southwest Church of Christ in Tigard, Oregon, and accredited through Oklahoma Christian University. Dr. Mark McLean will be teaching the course. The course may be taken for credit for only \$60, or audited for \$45.

Register through www.nwschoolofdiscipleship.com, and buy your own textbook, "Faithfully Different," (by Natasha Crain) at least one week prior to class. Memory work will be from the ESV translation of the Bible.

This course introduces students to the Christian worldview by familiarizing them with the story of the Bible and through exploring the fundamental tenets of the Christian faith. The course will compare the Christian worldview with other worldviews, most notably secular humanism. The course will also address strategies for Christian living in an increasing secular society, and how to reach out to those who do not share a Christian worldview.

This course is open to all adults over age 18. Join us for this academic and spiritual adventure!


