Who Are You Spurring On?

And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another - and all the more as you see the Day approaching. Hebrews 10:24-25 Familiar scriptures can sometimes lose their punch when we limit how we apply them in our life. This passage is most often used to encourage us to go to church—which is a good thing, but is this all the writer is encouraging Christians to do? No, not at all.

As I look at these verses, two phrases stand out: "spur one another on" and "but encouraging one another." Meeting together is important, not as an end in itself, but because this is where the spurring and encouraging happens. Church attendance is not about punching the clock with God, it's about what God has gathered us together to accomplish. When the church embraces its purpose to equip saints so that they can help build up the church (Eph. 4:12), powerful things happen and lives are changed.

I am one of those lives.

I have a cloud of witnesses who cheered me on in my younger life. One of those cheer leaders was Carole Colella. She came into my life when she responded to the invitation at a gospel meeting in Willingboro, NJ in 1978. She had been searching for a church that followed the Bible, which she had already been studying. She was a regular guest at our home as she and my mother studied together. She was also one of the voices God used to turn my heart to Christian service.

At that stage of my life I was living at home while attending college. At church I was leading youth group and singing, teaching Bible classes, doing door knocking evangelism and occasionally preaching. What seems clear as day now, was not clear at all to me then. I was aiming to be a lawyer or politician, thankfully I had cheerleaders, like Carole, who helped me hear God's calling and accept it. To this day she remains a great encouragement to me; even from Florida!

This is what disciples of Christ do to together. They spur each other on and encourage each other to use their gifts and talents for the Master. Gathering for worship is good but only if we use the time as God intended.

Who will you spur on and encourage this Sunday? The Day is approaching, let's use our time together as God designed it.

When they are challenged, they chose God and rather than ask for comfort from the persecution, they ask for boldness to keep speaking for God. May we have the same prayer. Please join us as we look deeper into Acts.

Why should I attend Bible class?

Have you ever asked yourself that question? "Should I go to Bible class?" The correct answer is YES! Even if you do not like the class teacher or think you already know the topic. The answer is yes. We have one on Sunday mornings and one on Sunday evenings; plus some small groups that are meeting at other times. We are to be a people of the Word, and that means that we study it together.
