The Family of God

But Jesus answered the one who was telling him and said, "Who is my mother? and who are my brethren?" And he stretched forth his hand toward his disciples, and said, Behold my mother and my brethren! For whosoever shall do the will of my Father which is in heaven, the same is my brother, sister, and mother (Matthew 12:48-50)

When Jesus is told that his mother and brothers are standing outside desiring to speak to him, he makes what at first glance seems to be a strange response, "Who is my mother and who are by brothers." Did he not know who they were? Certainly, he knew who they were and with this response is not in any way denying the earthly relationship but he is using this occasion to teach a great lesson about his real family, namely all who do the will of his father. Earthly families are important to all of us but the greatest, most important family is the family of God (Eph. 2:19-22).

We are new creatures in Christ, the old man of sin has been cast aside (Gal. 3:27, 2 Cor. 5:17, Col. 3:5-10). Being part of God's family, we are willing to change our lives, our views, our feelings and attachments in whatever ways are necessary to comply to the will of God our Father. We now live by the standard set forth in his word (1 John 5:1-4, James 1:21-22, John 14:15, 2 John 6).


I hear John as he says, "Behold what manner of love the Father hath bestowed on us that we should be
