Thank You to the Caregivers

Anthropologist Margaret Mead was once asked what the earliest sign of human civilization was among discovered fossils and artifacts. She didn't offer writings, drawings, weapons, or utensils as her answer. She said it was a human femur which showed evidence of a break and then complete healing. It usually takes a broken femur four to six months to heal, and a person would be very limited in hunting, gathering, or other actions of the ancient world which were necessary for survival. So this fossilized bone is a sign that other humans took care of this injured human during his or her time of healing. And this, according to Margaret Mead, is the first sign of civilized community - humans who take care of one another.

Many of you have been put in positions of caregiving - maybe to a spouse with dementia, to a child with a disability, to an aging parent, or to a friend recovering from surgery. Some even take on full-time caregiving work as a profession and become "experts" (if there is such a thing) in meeting the needs of those who are sick or dying. The caregiving work of a mother, especially with all the needs of young children, can be exhausting work. So why do we exhaust ourselves? Put professional careers on pause or even bring them to an end? Sacrifice income? Sacrifice sleep? Sacrifice vacation time? All for the sake of meeting the needs of hurt or disabled family members and friends. And sometimes we do it with the knowledge that the person's condition will likely end in death.

We do so because we know that God's mercies are new to each of us every morning (*Lamentations 3:22-23*). Every day is a gift. Every quality breath a person can take is worth the care to allow it. And if we have a gift of mercy in our hands, we are to offer that gift to others with cheerfulness (*Romans 12:8*). The Samaritan in Jesus' *Luke 10* parable is never referred to as "good." Jesus calls him the one who "proved to be a neighbor" (10:36). The lawyer called him "the one who showed mercy" (10:37). Whatever you want to call him, make sure you don't miss what Jesus says about how we respond to the Samaritan's actions: "Go and do the same" (10:37).

To those who offer care to others, thank you. Your work is vital. It is a Christlike ministry of mercy. Keep going and doing the same.
