The New Living Translation reads, “I rejoice in your word like one who discovers a great treasure.”

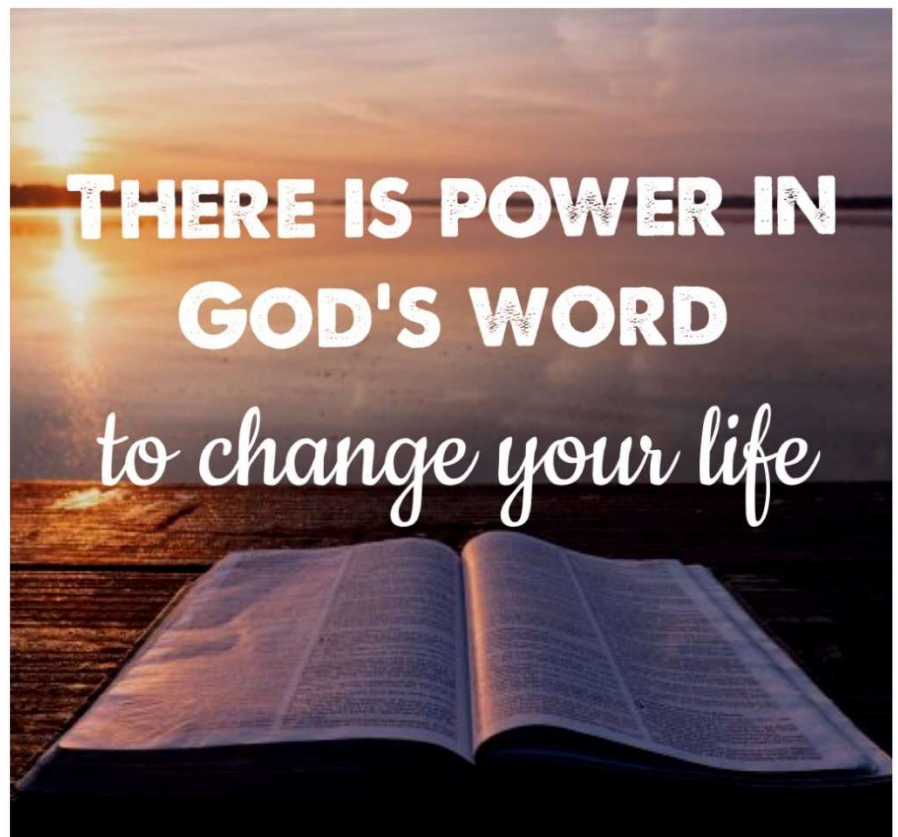

May we experience the joy of nothing better than spending time daily in His Word!


