The Words We Speak

He that keepeth his mouth, keepeth his life: but he that openeth wide his lips shall have destruction (Proverbs 13:3 - KJV).

The ability to speak words to express our thoughts and feelings is one of the great gifts given to us by our God. This is a gift that can be a tremendous blessing to us and others or if misused or abused it can have disastrous consequences for us. The words that we speak are a true index to our faith in God and our commitment to him. The words that flow from our mouths will testify to who we are and what we are (Matthew 12:33-37). Do not be mistaken, the words we choose to speak will reveal our character.

We should consider carefully the words of David from Psalms 39:1: *I said*, "I will guard my ways that I may not sin with my tongue; I will guard my mouth as with a muzzle while the wicked are in my presence." We need to take heed to the words we speak lest we be guilty of engaging in angry, wrathful words (Colossians 3:8). It is so easy to minimize our faults while magnifying others so we must guard our lips lest we be guilty of unjust fault finding (Matthew 7:3-5). Angry, wrathful speech has the power to start a long train of sad consequences and often we will find that we do not have the power to stop that train. Titus 3:2 tells us "to malign no one, to be peaceable, gentle, showing every consideration for all men." Speaking evil of someone we dislike or disagree with for whatever reason is all too common today. Using our power of speech in a deceitful way to make someone look bad just because we don't like them is wrong, yea sinful. We cannot be pleasing to God with our speech one moment and in the next moment be saying words of hatred with the intent to shame and tarnish the character of someone we disagree with or simply don't like (James 3:9-12).

As a child of God, our life should be a model of good works, showing integrity and dignity with sound speech that cannot be condemned (Matthew 5:16; James 3:13; Titus 2:1-8, Philippians 4:8-9; Colossians 3:5-17). I pray that the words we choose to speak will always show that the grace of God rules in our hearts.

Today, I leave you with these words: "Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be acceptable in your sight, O Lord, my rock and my redeemer" (Psalms 14:14).
