# **The First Question**

"Then the Lord God called to the man, and said to him, 'Where are you?" - Genesis 3:9

On the sixth day of creation, God created man and woman, male and female he created them (Genesis 1:26-27). The first man and woman, Adam and Eve, are given a beautiful garden to call home. In that garden they had every tree that was pleasing to the sight and good for food. They could eat of all of them except one, the tree of the knowledge of good and evil (Genesis 2:16-17). In the beginning, life for Adam and Eve was filled with joy and happiness without measure.

It has been said that no matter how well things are going in any given moment, trouble is just around the corner and so it is in the garden of Eden. We come to Genesis, chapter 3, and Satan having entered the serpent confronts Eve and through his influence Eve eats the forbidden fruit and then gives it to Adam who also ate it (Gen. 3:6). Now things get really interesting. The Lord God walks in the garden in the cool of the evening and calls out to Adam, "Where are you."

Are you standing fast in the faith (1 Cor. 16:13, Heb. 10:19-23, Matt. 6:33, Col. 3:1-3, 1 John 2:15-17, 2 Pet. 1:3-11)? I submit to you that each of us knows where we stand with the Lord God. If there is any doubt as to that standing, then we need to do something about it while we still can (Eccl. 9:10). To God be the glory forever and ever!
