# **Q & A with Paul: (Romans 8:9-17)**

Q: What is God's promise?

A: There is now no condemnation.

O: For who?

A: For those who are in Christ Jesus.

Q: Why?

A: Because through Christ Jesus, the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death.

Q: How?

A: "What the law was powerless to do, God did."

Q: Why was the law powerless?

A: It was weakened by the flesh.

Q: How did God do it?

A: He sent his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering.

Q: What happened?

A: He condemned sin in the flesh.

Q: Again, why?

A: in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fully met in us.

Q: Why us?

A: Because we don't live according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

Q: What's the difference?

A: Those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on what the flesh desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires.

O: What's the result?

A: The mind governed by the flesh is death, but the mind governed by the Spirit is life and peace.

Q: What does that really mean?

A: The mind governed by the flesh is hostile to God; it does not submit to God's law, nor can it do so. Those who are in the realm of the flesh cannot please God.

O: How do we fit into all this?

A: You are not in the realm of the flesh but are in the realm of the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God lives in you.

Q: What is the difference between having or not having the Spirit of God living in us?

A: If anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, they do not belong to Christ. But if Christ is in you, then even though your body is subject to death because of sin, the Spirit gives life because of righteousness. And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you.

Q: What then is our responsibility in all of this? A: Brothers and sisters, we have an obligation, but it is not to the flesh, to live according to it. For if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live. For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God.

Q: So, if we're obligated to follow the Spirit, we really have no choice. Doesn't that mean we have to give up our freedom to live as we please?

A: The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. And by him, we cry, "Abba, Father."

Q: How can we be assured of this?


A: The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children. Now, if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory.


