Reflections...

February 23, 2020

Speaker – Avery Stafford. February 23, 2020

Avery Stafford gave the sermon Sunday, titled "What is the Church"? He use the Bible passage, Matthew 16:13-28.

The sermon was about what Jesus' vision of <u>His</u> church was. This was the first time Jesus mentioned the church. He said He was going to build His church and hell will not prevail against it... not today... not ever.

Avery talked about counting the cost of the cross. In verse 24, Jesus says to "come after me". We need to "come after" Jesus like a bounty hunter comes after a criminal. The way we "come after" Jesus today, would He even know we were coming?

What does Jesus mean to deny ourselves? Jesus gave up everything at the cross; He gave up His life – and He gave it up willingly.

The church's success has nothing to do with what you want. Christ will measure His church by how much of your life you are willing to give up.
