I think you get the point, our lives were interrupted too. He continued, reading from his chosen scripture, Psalms 91:1-2, "Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadows of the Almighty. I will say to the Lord, 'He is my refuge and my fortress, my God in whom I trust.' "

Whether we gather or do not gather, the questions are, "How do we respond in times of crisis?" and "What should we do in this crisis?"

I love older people (elderly/seniors), my mother-in-law is the oldest person I know (save Dorothy, by six months) born shortly after one of history's worst pandemics, the Spanish Flu (1918) and has survived through four pandemics and is now living in the 5th pandemic that has occurred during her lifetime. I love the way she approaches crisis, hardship, and yes, even death. Her words, ever soothing, comforting words, ring ever truer, "You gotta just trust in the good Lord". Did you read that? "You gotta just trust in the good Lord"; simple, noble, humble, faithful truth.

We need to see Christ in the crisis. We need to run, not walk to Jesus and then hold on tight. Don't you know, every song that you and I have ever sung, each prayer that we have prayed, or have been touched by another's words, matters? Each of these experiences means something, it means and should remind us, we are covered by the blood of Jesus. You and I are protected in his sheltering arms. Psalm 34:7 reads, The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and he delivers them.

Some may lose their jobs, homes, diminished ability to provide for one's self. It's predicted that many more will become ill and sick, perhaps many more may even die. They, however, do not need to be sick alone, die alone or even be afraid alone. Just trust in the good LORD. Our job, our mission could not be any less important now than ever before, with the same zeal and desire as on the day we first believed and/or were baptized, ambassadors for Christ, sharing and proclaiming the good news of the Gospel. Introducing or reintroducing our friends and neighbors (and strangers) to Christ, in the midst of the crisis. Write a letter, send a card, call someone or check-in with a friend. Journal, blog, but most of all pray. We should speak - speak with power, boldly, as Peter did. Acts 5:20 says that when the angel of the Lord rescued him from prison, he said to Peter, "Go, stand in the temple courts, and tell the people all about this new life."

This new life is eternal life, covered in the blood of CHRIST. We are protected. That's the only way. No matter where we meet, we ARE still HIS Church, just trust, trust in the Good LORD.
