

# Renewal of Teaching/Learning

odliness is a learned behavior. It is contradictory to human nature. When left to ourselves, allowed to have our own way and do our own thing we become everything but godly. Godliness comes only through training and practice (I Timothy 4:8; 2 Timothy 3:16). It involves learning and self-control (2 Timothy I:7).

It should not surprise us, therefore, that in His infinite wisdom God established two great, yet basic teaching organisms--one is the home, the other is the church. Both are important! The responsibility of parents teaching their own children is clearly stated in Scripture (Ephesians 6:4; Proverbs 22:6). The strength of early training by parents is well documented even in secular writings and in Scripture (2 Timothy 1:5; 3:14-15). It simply must not be neglected.

The church also has a teaching responsibility, not as a substitute for negligent parents, but as the "pillar and

ground of the truth" (I Timothy 3:15), making known the "manifold wisdom of God" (Ephesians 3:10), "teaching and admonishing one another" (Colossians 3:16). The early church grew as it did and developed as it did because they were teaching and being taught (Acts 18:11; 2 Timothy 2:2). The church today must not take her teaching responsibility lightly. We must do the very best we can, for the sake of godliness.

But, how much importance do we place on the teaching responsibility of the church? How serious are we about teaching? How serious are we about learning? Have we forgotten that we are, first of all, students of the Word of God? This may sound a little negative, but please consider it anyway, okay? Why is it that we, as parents, expect, even demand, that our children not only attend classes, but also that they do their lessons and even make as good grades as possible--all that merely for a secular education? Why is that? When at the same time we permit our children to miss Bible classes for work, week-end trips, sports activities, and even to do their public school homework. Why is it that our children go to public

school each day well-equipped with paper, notebook, pens, lessons ready, and we even insist that they get there on time? But when Sunday comes these same students arrive totally unprepared for learning--no Bible, nothing to write with, lesson not prepared, and not even in the class room on time.

The problem, and, of course, the solution, does not lie with the children, but with the adults. I would suspect that there are more adults taking college level courses today than at any time in our history. Many of us are presently enrolled in such classes. When we enroll, we are expected to attend, study, participate and learn. We expect it of ourselves and commit ourselves to it, allotting the required amount of study time necessary to complete that course. Why aren't we that serious about the Bible classes? When parents and other adults who know what it takes to successfully complete a course of study, continually come to Bible class unprepared to learn, without their textbook (Bible) and arrive late--we really can't expect much "life-changing-learning" to take place--neither in us, nor our children.

In this "Year of Renewal," this is a call for renewal of a strong emphasis upon Bible teaching/learning, and doing it well. I would urge three things. First, let us insist that every teacher in every Bible class be qualified, prepared and seriously committed to "life-changing-teaching." Not every Christian is called to be a teacher (James 3:1). It is a frightening responsibility for one to assume when he is unqualified for it.

Second, as a Bible school, let us be sure that we are offering quality, well-defined courses of study for children and adults as well. Each course should have clear objectives, a definite beginning point, and an end. Not merely classes which go on indefinitely where we are "always learning but never able to come to a knowledge of the truth."! (2 Timothy 3:7).

Finally, let us as students commit ourselves to "life-changing-learning." The primary purpose of our Bible classes is not fellowship. We do not attend Bible class simply because that is just a part of church. The one and only purpose of our Bible classes is teaching/learning. Teaching isn't done until learning takes place. And learning doesn't happen without effort on the part of the student. Let's go to class prepared, tools in hand, expecting to learn.

Yes, I know this is too long. I also know that some may think it too harsh and negative and take it wrong. But I hope not. I just believe that if we are not "being renewed in knowledge in the image of (our) Creator" then any other effort at renewal will be futile.

#### Women's Roles

As you are aware, a continuing conversation of women's roles in the church was held during our monthly congregational meeting on Sunday, February 17th. As a result of the conversation, it was decided that we would revisit the topic again after the potluck on March 10th around 1:30pm and it is anticipated that those in attendance will have studied and will be prepared to continue the conversation on the following points:

Can Women:

- Lead Scripture reading during the worship service?
- Lead prayer during the worship service?
- ♦ Lead communion?
- Serve communion?
- Preach during the worship service?
- Be a song leader or praise team leader during worship?

During the course of the conversation, the question was raised regarding the issuing of a survey in which individuals may give their preferences about each of these points: yes, no, not sure/no opinion. This survey may be considered after the March 10th meeting.

In the meantime, it was decided that a video the deacons have viewed regarding this topic also be viewed by the members of the congregation as a starting point. The video was prepared by a Churches of Christ minister and details the Scriptural reasoning for the Churches of Christ stand on the role of women in the Church. Members are free to view any information they would like and use that during our conversation on March 10th.

The Deacons want to express that WE ALL come with love on our hearts and peace in our ears. This is a conversation among brothers and sisters IN CHRIST! PLEASE be willing to listen and share.
