God has always urged His people to be thankful. The Old What happens when we give thanks? What are the bless-Testament lists a number of different offerings man was to give to God...sin offerings, fellowship offerings, guilt offerings, grain offerings, thank offerings, and more. And though the thank offering is listed along with all the others, it is different in that it can also be the intent of any of the other offerings. So there were sin offerings and sin offerings of thanksgiving, fellowship offerings and fellowship offerings of thanksgiving, grain offerings and grain offerings of thanksgiving, and so on.

God wants His people to be thankful and to express their thanks. Thank offerings generally involved songs of joy and gladness, celebration, praise and rejoicing, sharing stories of the acts of God. And the most common expressions of gratitude that came from all of this recognized two things about God...first of all, that "God is good" and secondly, that "His love endures forever." (See Psalm 107).

Giving thanks causes us to notice the good even more, and to be more thankful. Grumbling and complaining causes us to notice the bad even more, and to be more sour.

I found this statement in the Psalms a few days ago, a statement that must have been there all along, but overlooked...by me at least.

"He who sacrifices thank offerings honors me, and he prepares the way so that I may show him the salvation of God." -Psalm 50:23

First part, "He who sacrifices thank offerings to me..." Pretty clear. God is honored when we give thanks.

Second part, not so clear, "and he prepares the way so that I may show him the salvation of God." Ah, getting clearer. The one who gives thanks prepares the way so that God

Trip to Skagit Valley/RoozenGaarde

Contact Ken Avery if you are interested in going to the Skagit Valley Tulip Festival. *Ken is planning to rent a bus in order to drive some of our elders and seniors up there.* If you are interested in a seat on the bus, remember to let Ken know. Let us know too if you want to follow along in your own vehicle and go as part of the group. See address above.

Date: Monday, April 29th

Time: Meet at POCOC at 8:45am to leave at 9:00am. Estimated time of getting back to the building is 5pm depending on traffic and other delays. The bus may take the ferry on the return trip to avoid Seattle and Tacoma afternoon/evening traffic.

Clothing: Comfortable shoes for walking. One to three light warm layers you can remove or add on as needed because it is cool in the shade and warmer in the fields but when the breeze blows it can be quite cool in both. Other articles to think about: hats, sunglasses, sunblock, water bottles, hand wipes or sanitizer.

Mobility: The pathways through the RoozenGaarde fields are packed down and smooth enough for walking barefoot so wheels on chairs and other supports should have no difficulty. Paths through the garden sections of RoozenGaarde are trodden-down, flat, sparse grass in some places and flat gravel on hard-packed dirt in others. Wheels should not be a hindrance in these areas. If you have a walker with a seat, consider bringing that one for resting on.

Lunch: Pack your own lunch or snacks if you do not wish to purchase food inside RoozenGaarde. Food bought inside Roozengaarde might require cash only so be prepared.

Entry Fees: <u>The entry fees for those 65 and up are being</u> <u>covered.</u> All others are \$7, with children under age 5 being free. There is also a \$1 discount with military ID. Payment can be made by check, card, or cash. There is an ATM in the parking lot if you have need.

Gift Shop: The RoozenGaarde gift shop has a lot of very nice items including very real-looking faux tulips. If you are interested, the shop is worth a browse.

Cameras: You will want to take pictures so bring a camera! Visitors are allowed to go about 3 feet in between the rows in the fields but no further as foot traffic harms the bulb crop.
