onduras is a country that is hurting; a people pleading for help; a land stricken with poverty; a country of over seven million people who are threatened daily with disease and death from their water, food, and poor sanitation; where over fifty percent of its population is below the poverty line; and where over three hundred thousand children under the age of sixteen live on the streets.

For many of these children, their inescapable feelings of starvation are forgotten by taking drugs, but only for a moment. 12,000 children die each year, thirty-six each day, of diseases that could have been prevented. What's more devastating than all of this is that hundreds of these people are on their way to hell. There is a country who needs our help; the country of Honduras.

We've partnered with Missionary Pastor Matt Goins in El Progresso, Honduras, to create <u>Team Honduras</u>. On the 10 acres of land we have purchased, we have built a church building as well as the first Hope of Honduras Children's Home Cottage.

The Lord called <u>John and Rachelle Gardner</u>, along with their four children, to be the house parents for Hope of Honduras Children's Home. John & Rachelle have the desire to see the children of Honduras come to a saving knowledge of

Jesus Christ while providing them with a home and meeting their daily needs."

Hope Children's Home in Tampa

"Founded in 1968, Hope Children's Home has rescued nearly 5,000 children between the ages of infant to 18 years of age. Most of these children have been discarded, abused, unwanted, or orphaned although some of the children have simply come out of a situation where a parent just needed help."²

"Hope Children's Home receives no State or Federal funding and is entirely supported by churches, private individuals, clubs, and organizations. The faith that we exercise each and every day for our needs is a faith that is passed on to the children as they see God's faithful hand of provision."²

"For 40 years, Hope Children's Home has taken children in and tried to make a difference in their very impressionable lives. We feel that God has called us to help rebuild the broken lives of these children and to build the bridge, when possible, between home, parent, and child. labor are the thousands of young people across the country who are now productive adults raising their own children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord."²

"Hope Christian School is also located on our property and is accredited by the state of Florida, providing a private, quality, Christian education to each of our children including a well-rounded sports program. Our school program begins in our Nursery through the 12th grade. Over 90% of the students who graduate from Hope Christian School will continue to college."²

Along the way there have been many trials and Satan has tried to damage the work being done but they have survived and when the call came to do this work in Honduras they pressed on and the first cottage was built in 2011.

And while all of this was going on God was working on the future of the Honduras team:

Darrell and Laura Fry's granddaughter Rachelle Tilman met John Gardner at

Cascade Christian College in Portland over 10 years ago. Drawn together by a similar quirky sense of humor and love of the Lord their relationship developed quickly. John told her early on you need to know I plan to go work in an orphanage probably in Africa and Rachelle took that dream on with him. They married and after a short time in Texas John joined the Air Force and they saw quite a bit of the world. The dream never left them. They were stationed in Florida. July 2014 they were asked to be chaperones for the church youth group mission to Honduras to work at Hope Children's Home. It was there that they felt the call to become involved in this ministry and work with Hope Children's Home. John still needed to finish out his service time but they made contact with Hope's home campus in Tampa. They went through the interview process and by the time John was out of the military they had sold most of their

furnishings and belongings and made the move to Tampa in July 2015.

They received training in every aspect and eventually became house parents at one of the Tampa cottages. It was an amazing time and now they had 4 children of their own along with about 16 others.

Always working toward the goal they eventually entered language school and arrived in Honduras January 2018.

There have been lots of adventures; some would call them obstacles but Rachelle and John see them as opportunities to see God's hand in blessing the work with these precious children.
