nitially called Chuckwagon until approximately 5 years ago, Meals on Wheels Kitsap has been providing and delivering nutritive meals to homebound Seniors 60 years and older for 45 years.

Home Delivered Meals are well-balanced and nutritive meals delivered to those seniors who are homebound due to illness or disability and unable to prepare meals for themselves. Community Dining Meals allow adults 60 years and older to connect with others while having a hot, nutritionally -balanced meal at noontime at various locations around Kitsap County. Both are available with a suggested donation of \$3.00 and no one is turned down if unable to give a donation.

Liquid Nutrition Meal supplements are available for those seniors with medical needs.

Nutrition, Education and Dietary Counseling is available for all MOWK clients at no charge. The dietician plans nutritionally-balanced meals appropriate for seniors.

Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program provides fresh, locally-grown fruits and vegetables to seniors 60 years and over and qualified low-income seniors 60 and over. Produce is purchased with vouchers at local farmers markets or delivered directly to homebound seniors June through October.

MOWK continually shows their appreciation and caring to the seniors they provide for. Many of the homebound seniors' only contact is with the drivers. The drivers do wellness checkups on their seniors and if needed will report anything that needs to be addressed. Often when these seniors are hospitalized, the drivers visit them in the hospital or even bring them an occasional treat. Friendships are developed.

To help ease the loneliness many of the homebound seniors feel, MOWK shows their appreciation though many gestures. Here at POCOC the Ladies prayer Group have made up birthday boxes that the drivers take with the meals for the senior who is celebrating their birthday that day or week. Volunteers put together long-stemmed carnations for the women for Mother's day, the gentlemen get a special key ring set on Father's day. We package little bags of candy at Valentine's' Day; at Jingle Fest we collect warm outer clothing for those homebound. Emergency meal packages are made up for those homebound in case of electric outages to name just a few things provided for the seniors here in Kitsap County. *(Continued on back page.)*



Currently there are 2 full-time paid employees and 8 part-time paid employees out of the MOWK office in Bremerton. There are 125 volunteers throughout the county serving the meals, delivering the meals, various fundraisers, marketing and office work. This past year they served 800 seniors with congregate and home delivered meals in the amount of 57,000 meals. In addition the Emergency meals, Senior Farmers Market, Nutritional Education and Dietary Counseling adds 4000 more meals.

Funding for this non-profit organization comes from grants, donations, and fundraisers.

I have been privileged and proud to be a part of this organization for the past 5 years. I volunteer in the office, working with spreadsheets. I also, for the past 5 years, have been the co-coordinator of MOWK's Jingle Fest Craft and Gift Show held each November. We started out 5 years ago at the Community Center in
