

Courage or Comfort by Tiffany Rousseau

In the Gospel of Luke, we see a side of Jesus we only see a few times throughout his journey. Luke records Jesus warning his disciples to stay awake and not fall into the temptation of sleep on the eve of Christ's crucifixion, then goes off to pray. Chapter 22v41-44 says,

"He withdrew about a stone's throw beyond them, knelt down and prayed, 'Father, if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will, but yours be done.' An angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. And being in anguish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground." (NIV)

Jesus was distraught. He was discomforted and did not want to die. But his desire to live conflicted with his desire to save the world from its never-ending battle against sin. He was torn in two, like the curtain in the Tabernacle, wringing with anxiety to the point of exhaustion. It took an angel to help build him up while his followers were sleeping and unaware of the depth of his anguish.

A few Sundays ago, I shared something with our congregation because the Holy Spirit has put it on my heart to share.

We Christians can choose courage or we can choose comfort, but we cannot have both.

Jesus could have lived. Jesus could have not saved us all from sin. He could have changed the course of events then and there. He could have chose what was comfortable and easier for him.

But he didn't.

Jesus chose to have courage, to be strong, to go into the next day where men would mock him, spit on him, despise him, and kill him. He did it because his desire to save us outweighed his desire to live, and he knew what would be on the other side of this struggle: salvation. Deliverance. Death defeated. Grace.

We too have a desire, Church. We have a desire "to give our families, friends and neighbors a compelling opportunity to accept the grace of God." This is our calling, our mission, and our purpose. This is what God desires for us. It is His will! But it takes COURAGE. And we are guilty of choosing COMFORT. God does not want us to stop, to sit back, to be catered to, or to be afraid. He is urging us with his Holy Spirit to have courage, to push forward, to reach out and to make ourselves tools for His kingdom.

As followers of Jesus, we must behave like him. Make a commitment today to stop living in comfort. By the request of Jesus, go into your closet, pray the Lord's prayer, and make a commitment to have courage. Whatever that means to you, figure it out, listen to the Holy Spirit guide you, and walk forward with courage.
