From the Tiny Village Team

Monday this week, the tiny village team met with Commissioner Garrido; Doug Washburn, Director Kitsap County Department of Human Resources; Nancy Olsten, Director Kitsap Mission; Bridget Callahan, Housing Solutions Center; and Stuart Grogan, Director Kitsap Housing. Our primary goal was to understand the resident selection process and how we might ensure only high functioning/low risk residents are referred to the tiny village. In addition we discussed insurance/liability for the village, property tax on the land where the village is proposed, the draft of village/resident rules, and a standard for resident use/alteration of cabins.

A little bit about each of the attendees as listed above and their role in the tiny village process... Commissioner Garrido is the elected official that is spear-heading a tiny village in South Kitsap. Doug currently has oversight in the coordination of the tiny village process and he chaired the meeting. Bridget Callahan and the Housing Solutions Center conducts interviews and screening for those seeking help with all unsheltered issues. When/if an individual meets the screening requirements for village residency their information would be forwarded to Kitsap Rescue Mission. Nancy Olsten and Kitsap Rescue

Mission will conduct interviews and make the referral for placement in the tiny village. Kitsap Rescue Mission has developed village rules, currently in draft form. Stuart, with Kitsap Housing, has been involved in multiple building projects and was able to make several valuable suggestions.

The tiny village team has a follow up meeting next week with Bridget and the Director of Housing Solutions Center. We will review the current resident screening process and make recommendations for changes/additions/ deletions. This week we will also be reviewing the draft of village rules and forwarding our recommendations for changes/additions/deletions to Nancy at Kitsap Rescue Mission.

One of our team goals from the beginning has been to ensure the message/information we share is focused, consistent, and easily available. With our members we have used the weekly bulletin, Tuesday update, congregational business meetings, the bulletin boards in the foyer, and Sunday mornings. With more and more interest by non-members we feel it is important for our webpage to have

Most of the information will not be POCOC specific but will address the tiny village in general.

There will be a community meeting hosted by the League of Women Voters at the Givens Community Center on Wednesday August 15th, from 6:30 to 8:30pm. Everyone in the community is invited to attend. This will be an organized education event and the primary focus will be to provide an understanding of what tiny villages are and how they operate. It will not be specific to POCOC as a potential site for placement. There will be time after the presentation for questions and answers.
