The Father's Business

 - Do not be satisfied with a quick quote like, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel..." That is good. It's biblical and it is right. But be clearer. Be more specific "God, I have all of these responsibilities today. And our church is busy with this and that and the other. They're good things. And we'll do our best to do them well. But are these **what you want us to do?** Is this how we can please you?"

We must be about our Father's business. Not our own. Not that of our church... OUR FATHER'S BUSINESS.


