1 Timothy 2:3-4 This is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior who desires all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth.

Perhaps the greatest question to ever cross the lips of man is the one found in Luke 10:25 when the lawyer stood before Jesus and asked, "What must I do to inherit eternal life"? It is the same question asked by the young man in Matthew 19:16, heard in Acts 2:37 and echoed by the Philippian jailor in Acts 16:30.

God wants all men to be saved and the eternal safety of those who believe in and obey him is one of those exceedingly precious promises found in God's word (1 John 3:1-2; Colossians 1:12-14; Hebrews 5:8-9; John 3:16-17; Romans 5:8-9).

Over many years of preaching, teaching classes, writing weekly bible thoughts, I have often wished that I had the ability to reach deep down into my soul and find the words to speak or write that would be so powerful they would move all who heard or read them to do everything within their power to make their journey to eternity a safe one. I have never attained that ability or found those words, I do pray that all of us can with a heart of sincerity cry out as did David in Psalms 16:1, "Preserve me O God, for in thee do I put my trust".

Be happy, enjoy life to the fullest, have fun and treasure the moments you have with family and friends but as you do, never forget for a moment that the eternal safety of your soul is at stake every waking moment of every day. In the first chapter of Colossians, Paul speaks of the love the brethren in Colossae have for God, Christ, the saints and him. In verses 9-10, Paul expresses four desires he has for those brethren: that they will be filled with knowledge of God's will and understanding, walk in a manner worthy of the Lord, please God in all respects and increase in the knowledge of God. I firmly believe that all 4 of these desires must be an integral part of our lives is we are going to be successful in inheriting eternal life.

It is not a matter of whether or not God wants us to be saved (2 Peter 3:9). It is only a matter of whether or not we are willing to do whatever he says we must do. Faithful children of God have a glorious hope that strengthens them and enables them to press onward through this life as they eagerly anticipate that day when they will celebrate going home to their eternal dwelling place (2 Cor. 5:1-2). O, what a celebration that will be!
